January 2024 Monthly Highlights

- January saw a 7% month-on-month increase in gas used, but this was the lowest amount used in Britain at the start of a year since 2020, pointing to a relatively mild final third of the month.
- The share of the UK's gas supply coming from the UKCS (UK Continental Shelf) and Norway dropped a little to 64% (from 72%) as we made use of our healthy storage reserves. Storage share of supply jumped to 11% - the highest for 3 years.
- Due to the cold middle of the month, the demand share figure for Local Distribution Zones (domestic properties) rose to 69% - the largest for almost 2 years. Power stations also demanded more gas and this was underlined on 11th January when over a quarter of gas demand was for Power.
